

INFORMATION FOR UNIPV INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS ON COVID PROVISIONS ON TRAVELS AND ENTRANCE IN ITALY

last update 14/09/2020

If you are coming to Pavia from abroad, check what to do upon your arrival and which are your obligations according to the Italian law concerning Covid-19.

F	Kosovo, Montenegro, Serbia	From these countries a ban on entry into Italy is still in force, with the exception of EU citizens (including Italian citizens) and their family members who have been resident in Italy since before 16 July 2020 (in this case, please refer to groups B and C rules).
F	Colombia	From these countries a ban on entry into Italy is still in force, with the exception of EU citizens (including Italian citizens) and their family members who have been resident in Italy since before 13 august 2020 (in this case, please refer to groups B and C rules).
E	Rest of the World (after a stay or even only transit)	<p>1. you must undergo a 14 days period of fiduciary isolation and health surveillance. FAQs:

Question	Response
COVID TEST (molecular or antigenic test)	
For students who come from or have transited in Spain, Croatia, Greece, Malta, etc., the test is free only if taken at the Fortunati Stadium on Wednesdays and Thursdays or also in other locations?	No, the test is free even if taken at conventional laboratories and/or private locations (<u>complete list</u>), but it must be prescribed by your general practitioner from the “red prescription” and exemption code “P01.”
Students coming from or having transited in Spain, Croatia, Greece, or Malta, that <u>have not done</u> a test resulting negative 72 hours before their arrival to Italy, should travel from the airport to Pavia only with private transportation or taxi?	The use of private transportation or taxi is not obligatory but strongly recommended.
Students coming from or having transited in Spain, Croatia, Greece, or Malta, that <u>have done</u> a test resulting negative 72 hours before their arrival to Italy, can move and leave without limitations?	Yes, if the test is done 72 hours before arrival.
And, instead, if they have been tested at the airport or Pavia, should they observe the mandatory self-quarantine until they receive the test results?	Yes, the mandatory self-quarantine is obligatory until the arrival of test results.



SELF-QUARANTINE AND FIDUCIARY ISOLATION	
Is fiduciary isolation mandatory?	<p>If it is listed as a duty for the group you belong to, fiduciary isolation is mandatory, and its violation is sanctioned by Italian law.</p> <p>There are some limited exceptions:</p> <p>provided that no symptoms of COVID-19 occur, there have been no stays or transits in one or more countries on lists C and F during the fourteen (14) days before entering to Italy, without prejudice to the obligations set out in Article 5 of the Decree of the President of the Council do Ministers (compilation of an appropriate declaration), the provisions relating to the obligation of fiduciary isolation and health surveillance and the use of private means of transport to reach the final destination (and swab for Croatia, Greece, Malta and Spain) do NOT apply to anyone (regardless of nationality) who enters Italy for a period not exceeding 120 hours for proven needs of work, health or absolute urgency, with the obligation, at the end of that period, to leave the national territory immediately or, failing that, to begin the period of surveillance and fiduciary isolation.</p> <p>For more information, please visit:</p> <p>http://www.salute.gov.it/portale/nuovocoronavirus/dettaglioContenutiNuovoCoronavirus.jsp?lingua=english&id=5412&area=nuovoCoronavirus&menu=vuoto</p>
If a student comes from or transited in the countries of groups C, D, E, and F, does he/she have to undergo self-quarantine independent of his/her nationality? are EU citizens exempt from a mandatory self-quarantine?	Mandatory self-quarantine is obligatory for all students originating or transiting from said countries.



Is it allowed to carry out the mandatory self-quarantine in a hotel or other private accommodation (hostel, B&B)?	Yes, if ideal quarantine conditions (dedicated room and bathroom, avoiding any contact with other persons, utilizing a mask when interacting with others, and daily sanitization of the room and bathroom) are guaranteed.
If a student observing the mandatory self-quarantine shares an apartment, what should they do? Are there obligations?	They must avoid any contact with other persons, use a dedicated room and bathroom, utilize a mask when interacting with others, and daily sanitization of the dedicated room and bathroom.
TEST RESULTS	
If a student results positive, what should they do?	<p>If the positive person is symptomatic (having a cough, cold, fever, lost the sense of smell and/or taste, etc.), they should stay in a mandatory self-quarantine for 14 days until a certified recovery of 2 consecutive negative test results within a 24 hour period. The two tests must be organized after 14 days from the clinical recovery (= relief of symptoms).</p> <p>If the person is asymptomatic, they should stay in isolation for a 14 day period after resulting positive at the test.</p>
